Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded on January 16, 1920, on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C. Since its inception, the Sorority has chronicled a number of firsts. Zeta Phi Beta was the first Greek-letter organization to charter a chapter in Africa (1948); to form adult and youth auxiliary groups; to centralize its operations in a national headquarters; and to be constitutionally bound to a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated.



Community Service

Since 1920, the Zeta legacy has been firmly secured in service to our community and all humanity. Sigma Phi Zeta participates in our national initiatives such as:

- ZHOPE—Zetas Helping Other PeopleExcel.
- Stork's Nest – Our partnership with the March of Dimes to encourage women to seek prenatal care.
- ZNEF – The National Educational Foundation awards scholarship grants to worthy students for the pursuit of higher education.
